“Arigato!” INU Hosts Korean Cultural Experience Event for Japanese Sister University Students

Sixty students from Japanese sister universities of INU are currently engaging in a meaningful cultural experience event held from August 7th to 18th at INU. Hailing from institutions like Kyoto University of Foreign Studies, Tokyo Metropolitan University, Sonoda Women's University, Aomori University, Osaka International University, Chikushi Jogakuen University, Kanagawa University, Kitakyushu University, Fukuoka University, Hiroshima Shudo University, and Seinan Jo Gakuin University, these Japanese students are immersing themselves in a two-week program of Korean language lessons, attending professional baseball games, visiting traditional markets, and partaking in the wearing of hanbok, the traditional Korean attire.

The event, organized annually by INU, was temporarily halted for two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but made a triumphant return in 2022. This initiative not only fosters cultural exchange and mutual understanding between the students of both countries but also provides a platform for academic institutions to strengthen their bonds through such vibrant initiatives.
