Target

N3/Level 3 or less in Japanese Language Proficiency Test. Beginners are welcome, however those who have no knowledge of Japanese characters must learn hiragana and katakana before joining the program

Class Hours: Mon - Fri, 3 hours/day, approx. 31 hrs. in total

Class Numbers: Approx. 10 students/class

Placement Test: This will be held on the first day of the program in order to ensure that each participant is able to study in a class of the appropriate level.
